

Life Skills Trainer (Peer Support Specialist)

Skills Trainers (Peer Support Specialists) provide supports to individuals, families, and/or groups. This position meets with clients in the community, in the office, and/or virtually to address needs outlined in the treatment plan by the mental health therapist. Skills worked on with clients can include accessing resources, parent development/mentorship, social skills practice, racial/cultural self-confidence, case management, and the like.

Responsibilities

- Provide direct support to individuals within scope of practice and as indicated on the individual's treatment plan.
- Provide structured development activities and supports which may include skills training for psychosocial problems, racial identity development, relationship management, and/or working with systems of care.
- Make timely, accurate, and complete documentation in the electronic service record summarizing individuals' progress.
- Actively participate in staff and team meetings.
- Provide supportive case management services.
- Maintain professional and ethical standards of conduct.
- Implement behavior management strategies to promote positive behaviors and reduce challenging behaviors.
- Facilitate individual/family development of life skills for achieving clinical goals.
- Involve and advise family members, when appropriate.
- Meet with individuals in the office, in the community, and virtually.
- Collaborate with interdisciplinary professionals.
- Monitor client's emotional well-being and report risky/unsafe behaviors.
- Train clients in behavioral health and relationship management techniques.
- Maintain client confidentiality.
- Keep up-to-date with skills training knowledge appropriate to the client groups served.
- Keep up-to-date with supervisions.
- Maintain continuous compliance with OARs and OHA/THW training requirements.

- Behavior management techniques and strategies.

- Excellent communication skills to effectively interact with individuals, their families, the community, and the interdisciplinary team.
- Direct support to adults, families, and youth.

- Certification through Oregon Health Authority (OHA) as a Traditional Health Worker (THW)
